- Municipal and community capacity building



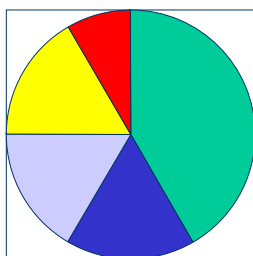
